Georgia Tech's SciTrain University project is looking for **STEM instructors** to take part in a study for the Spring 2009 semester. Instructors will:

- Use appropriate SciTrain University web content for consideration in accommodation practices in your classroom: www.catea.gatech.edu/scitrainU
- Attend at least three SciTrain U workshops
- Implement (with support from CETL staff) select accommodations/improvements to enhance learning for all students, including students with disabilities
- Monitor student successes and challenges
- Report on perceived effectiveness of accommodations and improvements via:
 - a required weekly online reflection journal
 - an optional 1-hr focus group discussion after end of term
 - an optional follow-up survey after end of term
- Provide students information on SciTrain evaluations - students can participate to help assess their own achievements and experiences (student stipends may be included for participation in certain focus groups or surveys)

Instructors will be compensated \$400 for participating, with a potential bonus of \$200 for providing exceptional reflective journal feedback, another \$50 for focus group participation, and \$50 for follow-up survey completion.
